





increasing capacity for Nations to participate


Advance Common Interests:

The L3 IAMC Monitoring Program:

- 10 Indigenous Monitors trained
- 40 on-site Monitoring events



Capacity & Training

- Series of Training available for Indigenous Monitors

Series of Training available for Indigenous Nations

Line 3 IAMC ACHIEVEMENTS (cont'd)



Advice to Government and the Regulator

- Submitted Advice Report with 55 Recommendations
- Advise Enbridge, CER and NRCAN regularly



Integration of Indigenous Knowledge

- Training provided to CER and NRCAN
- Reflection in advancement of Enbridge and CER activities (Eg Emergency Management)

Communications and Engagement


- Sharing information
